Admission Policy for St Patrick's Catholic Voluntary Academy (Hallam)

Nursery 2024/2025

St Patrick's Nursery has 26 places, 16 full time and 20 part time (10 am sessions / 10 pm sessions) for children aged over 3 years.

Children attend for 15 hours (Funded Early Learning) and there are 30 hours places available for those who are eligible for Extended Funded Early Learning.

Children are usually admitted to Nursery in September.

Oversubscription Criteria

Where there are more applications for places than the number of places available, places will be offered according to the following order of priority.

1. Catholic children (see note 1)
2. Catechumens and members of an Eastern Christian Church (see notes 2&3)
3. Children of other Christian denominations whose membership is evidenced by a minister of religion (see note 4)
4. Children of other faiths whose membership is evidenced by a religious leader (see note 5)
5. Siblings of current primary school children (see note 6)
6. Any other children

Within each of the categories listed above, the following provision will be applied in the following order.

- (i) The attendance of a brother or sister at the school at the time of enrolment will increase the priority of an application within each category so that the application will be placed at the top of the category in which the application is made after children in (i) above (see note 6).

Tie Break

Should the limit be reached mid category, the Governing Body will allocate places to the oldest children first, using the date of birth provided with the application.

Closing Date for Applications

Completed applications must be received at St Patrick's by Friday 19th April 2024. Application forms are available on the school website, beside this policy.

Notes (these notes form part of the oversubscription criteria)

1. 'Catholic' means a member of a Church in full communion with the See of Rome. This includes the Eastern Catholic Churches. This will normally be evidenced by a certificate of baptism in a Catholic Church or a certificate of reception into the full communion of the Catholic Church. For the purposes of this policy, it includes a looked after child who is part of a Catholic family where a letter from a priest demonstrates that the child would have been baptised or received if it were not for their status as a looked after child (e.g. a looked after child in the process of adoption by a Catholic family).

For a child to be treated as Catholic, evidence of Catholic baptism or reception into the Church will be required. Those who have difficulty obtaining written evidence of baptism should contact their Parish Priest who, after consulting with the Diocese, will decide how the question of baptism is to be resolved and how written evidence is to be produced in accordance with the law of the Church.

2. 'Catechumen' means a member of the catechumenate of a Catholic Church. This will normally be evidenced by a certificate of reception into the order of catechumens.
3. 'Eastern Christian Church' includes Orthodox Churches, and is normally evidenced by a certificate of baptism or reception from the authorities of that Church.
4. "Children of other Christian denominations" means children who belong to other churches and ecclesial communities which, acknowledge God's revelation in Christ, confess the Lord Jesus Christ as God and Saviour according to the Scriptures, and, in obedience to God's will and in the power of the Holy Spirit commit themselves: to seek a deepening of their communion with Christ and with one another in the Church, which is his body; and to fulfil their mission to proclaim the Gospel by common witness and service in the world to the glory of the one God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. An ecclesial community which on principle has no credal statements in its tradition, is included if it manifests faith in Christ as witnessed to in the Scriptures and is committed to working in the spirit of the above.

All members of Churches Together in England and CYTÛN are deemed to be included in the above definition, as are all other churches and ecclesial communities that are in membership of any local Churches Together Group (by whatever title) on the above basis.

5. "Children of other faiths" means children who are members of a religious community that does not fall within the definition of 'other Christian denominations' at 6 above and which falls within the definition of a religion for the purposes of charity law. The Charities Act 2011 defines religion to include: A religion which involves belief in more than one God, and A religion which does not involve belief in a God.

Case law has identified certain characteristics which describe the meaning of religion for the purposes of charity law, which are characterised by a belief in a supreme being and an expression of belief in that supreme being through worship.

6. 'brother or sister' includes:
 - (i) all natural brothers or sisters, half brothers or sisters, adopted brothers or sisters, stepbrothers or sisters, foster brothers or sisters, whether or not they are living at the same address; and
 - (ii) the child of a parent's partner where that child lives for at least part of the week in the same family unit at the same address as the applicant.
7. A 'parent' means all natural parents, any person who is not a parent but has parental responsibility for a child, and any person who has care of a child.

Notes

1. Evidence of Catholic Baptism

If the application is for a place at the school for a Catholic child, evidence of Catholic baptism or reception into the Church is required. A certificate of baptism, or a certificate of reception into the full communion of the Catholic Church, must be provided at the same time as this form is returned to the school.

St Patrick's may request additional supporting evidence if the written documents that are provided do not clarify the fact that the child was baptised or received into the Catholic Church, e.g. where the name and address of the Church is not on the certificate, or where the name of the Church does not state whether it is a Catholic Church or not. Those parents/carers who have difficulty obtaining written evidence of baptism or reception into the Church should contact their Parish Priest.

2. Evidence for Catechumens

If the application is for a place for a catechumen, evidence of their being a member of the catechumenate of a Catholic Church is required. A certificate of reception into the order of catechumens must be provided at the same time as this form is returned to St Patrick's.

3. Evidence of Membership of an Eastern Christian Church

If the application is for a place for a member of an Eastern Christian Church, including Orthodox Churches, evidence of membership is required. A certificate of baptism or reception from the authorities of that Church must be provided at the same time as this form is returned to St Patrick's.

4. Evidence for Other Christian Denominations and Other Faiths

If the application is for a place as a member of another Christian denomination or another faith, a letter (on headed paper) confirming membership of that Christian denomination or faith, and signed by the appropriate minister of religion or faith leader, is required. The letter must be provided at the same time as this form is returned to St Patrick's.
